The Royal British Legion uses a broad definition of "Armed Forces community" – so even if you're not sure you fit in one of the categories above, it's worth checking your eligibility the website.</p> <p>If you're currently getting any means-tested state benefits, such as universal credit, pension credit or income support, you should qualify automatically. But you could still be eligible for a grant even if you don't get any benefits – the Royal British Legion will check your income and expenditure to assess your needs. Help for Households campaign – social tariffs	<p>The government has worked with a range of Internet Service Providers (IPs) and Mobile Network Operators (MNOs) to deliver low-cost broadband and phone service packages, called social tariffs, for those on low incomes. Social tariffs are available for people claiming Universal Credit, Pension Credit and some other benefits, with some providers offering deals from £15 a month.</p> <p>The Help for Households campaign homepage brings together over 40 support schemes that the public may be able to access depending on eligibility. Virgin Media- Free data and tech loans

- Providing over 60 million GB of free data to people who need it most. Also making connectivity more affordable for those hit hardest by the cost-of-living crisis. The price of our Essential Broadband social tariff for those receiving Universal Credit has been cut to £12.50 and have added a higher-speed tariff for £20 a month – all on monthly rolling contracts.
- Community Calling, a programme launched with environmental charity Hubbub. It’s enabled the rehoming of 13,000 tech devices in communities across the UK experiencing digital exclusion – and roll out five tech lending hubs across the UK. These provide tablets and free data to people living in temporary accommodation, including women seeking refuge from domestic violence, asylum seekers and people at risk of homelessness.
- Customers of both O2 and Virgin Mobile can now access the National Debtline, Business Debtline, Turn2us, Debt Advice Foundation and National Energy Action without using any of their mobile data. These organisations have been added to list of zero-rated websites, such as Citizens Advice, Money Advice Service and Step Change, so people can get advice on managing their finances without eating into their data allowances.
